Tensions that lead up to the Red River Resistance:

- HBC sells Rupert's Land without consulting Métis.
- Land surveyors trespassed into Métis property when Canada had not bought the land yet.



Action that caused the formation of the National Metis Committee	- Surveyors trespassed onto Métis Hay Privilege.

<b>Louis Riel's Provisional Government</b>	
Why was it formed? - Feared Orange Order + Lieutenant Governor William McDougall taking control and Métis loses rights.	What were their tasks and responsibilities in the government? - maintain order within the settlement. - help people of Red River negotiate an agreement to enter Confederation.

What was the mistake that Lieutenant Governor William McDougall made that caused the transfer of territorial power to Riel's provisional government?

- Proclaimed himself governor of the North-West Territories.
- Ran back across U.S. border.
- HBC transfers power to Métis because McDougall ran away.

<p>Louis Riel arrested John Schultz + members of Orange Order.</p> <p>- took over Fort Garry.</p>	<p>- Thomas Scott, a radical Orange Order member was killed by court marshal for committing treason.</p> <p>- Dr. Schultz escaped.</p>	<p>- Schultz portrayed Thomas Scott as a Protestant martyr whom was cruelly murdered by the hands of the "evil" Louis Riel.</p> <p>- Creation of Manitoba delayed.</p> <p>- MacDonald dispatched peacekeeping force consisting of Orange Order members.</p> <p>- Louis Riel exiled to the U.S.</p>

What were some of the good and the bad of John A. Macdonald's decisions after the Red River Resistance ended?

<u>Good</u>	<u>Bad</u>
<p>- granted Métis 200,000 hectares <del>to</del> <del>Metis</del> of land</p> <p>- allowed for Confederation + creation of the province, Manitoba.</p>	<p>- Colonel Wokeley's force to peace-keep Red River Settlement turned out to be a revenge-fest against Métis → even though Riel's provisional govt. was legitimate,</p>

MacDonald told the colonel to not treat it as one.
