# <u>Different Forms of Protest Groups</u>

#### Sit Down Protest

The definition of a sit-down is a protest where people sit in a particular location and don't move until their demands are met.

An example of a sit-down is when a factory worker is protesting a cut in wages by sitting at her station and refusing to leave.



### Saboteur

A person who does deliberate damage to something to protest about something

Saboteurs blew up a small section of the track.



# **Boycott**

A **boycott** is an act of voluntarily abstaining from using, buying, or dealing with a person, organization, or country as an expression of **protest**, usually for social or political reasons.



# Lobbying


A person paid to persuade politicians to vote a certain way on a bill; to either make the bill a law or to vote a bill down so it never passes.

#### Letters

A written declaration that is intended to record complaints concerning any operational matter that is performed by a recipient or other party; it is not a legal document, but simply a report of operations, contractual agreement, etc.

# Slogans

A slogan is a memorable <u>motto</u> or <u>phrase</u> used in a <u>clan</u>, <u>political</u>, <u>commercial</u>, <u>religious</u>, and other context as a repetitive expression of an idea or purpose.



## **Picketing**

**Picketing** is a form of <u>protest</u> in which people (called picketers)<sup>[1]</sup> congregate outside a <u>place of work</u> or location where an event is taking place. Often, this is done in an attempt to dissuade others from going in ("<u>crossing the picket line</u>"), but it can also be done to draw public attention to a cause.





#### **Petition Drive**

## **Demonstration**

A demonstration or street protest is action by a massgroup or collection of groups of people in favor of a political or other cause; it normally consists of walking in a mass march formation and either beginning with or meeting at a designated endpoint, or rally, to hear speakers.
